As well as reviewing what we think we know now about learning and teaching, the event will also look to the future: **what do practitioners and policy makers really need to know next?**

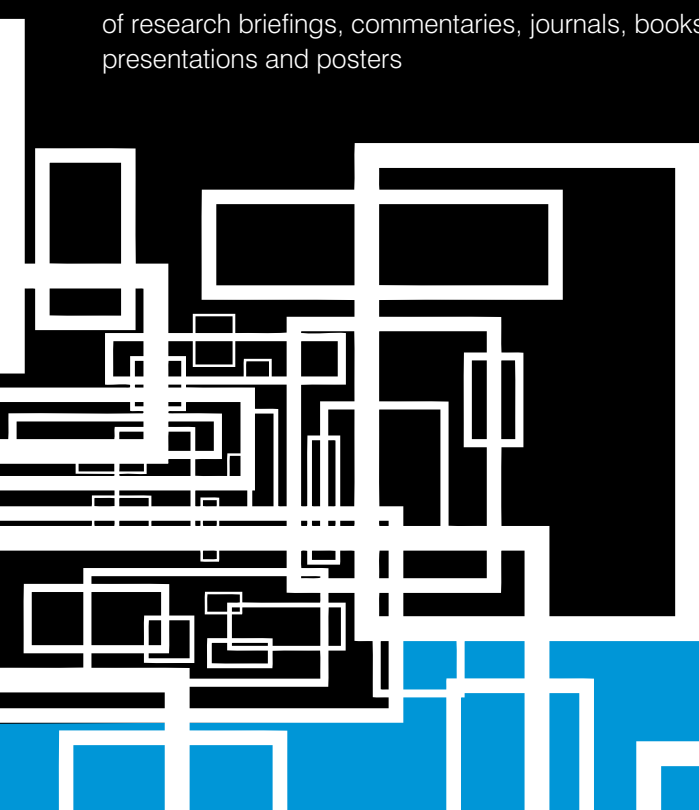
