Our Core workshop series this term include:

Evaluating the impact of CPD

This full day workshop explores the evidence behind effective CPD and how to evaluate it. We provide learning resources that generate formative and summative evidence for evaluating the impact of CPD and connecting staff and student learning. These tools help you build CPD capacity in your organisation and judge its impact.

Effective Mentoring and Coaching workshops

We offer a range of full day coaching workshops to show you how to use coaching in ways which make a difference to both staff learning and student learning. Explore with us, a series of practical tools that embed and sustain quality in coaching, tackle common obstacles, connect coaching with school development priorities and help you evaluate impact.





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Developing Growth Mindsets

This half day workshop explores practical ways of helping students who struggle when faced with challenges. It considers the impact of the beliefs students hold about themselves and how this affects their ability to achieve. The workshop provides strategies to combat fixed mindsets and replace with growth mindsets enabling them to work harder and achieve their potential. How this interacts with teachers' beliefs about ability is also examined.

What makes exceptional schools exceptional? An action research approach to school improvement

This one day workshop designed for secondary senior leaders considers the findings of the recent Teach First report comparing the key features and practices of exceptional and strong schools. This programme builds on these findings by supporting teachers in the design of a R&D project which moves your school towards exceptional.

Sauce for the Goose

This interactive half or one day workshop helps schools identify a research-informed, shared language about learning and teaching for both staff and students which builds a firm foundation of evidence about effectiveness at every level. It explores ways of evaluating the impact of professional learning both within school and across networks.

Using Response to Intervention: Breakthroughs in Literacy for vulnerable learners

Response to Intervention (RtI) has been shown to reduce the number of pupils falling behind and referrals to special education services. Rtl uses pupil assessment data to carefully select interventions which are provided in three tiers of increasing intensity. This 2 day programme

suggests how to use pupil premium funding to run RtI focused on vulnerable learners who are below Level 4 in Literacy. It offers key tools and resources to ensure a sustained and engaging opportunity for effective professional learning which leads through to improved student outcomes.

Using Research Lesson study for Closing the Gap

Many teachers know and understand that a structured and supported focus upon their lessons is a most powerful way to deepen the impact of their teaching interventions and improve student learning. This 1 full day and 2 half day programme looks at the practicalities of planning and supporting research lesson study (RLS) offering some key tools and resources to ensure a sustained and engaging opportunity for effective professional learning.

On occasions we also offer seminars to share new research findings and subsequently offer workshops in the light of emerging evidence.
